Public Safety Director Message:



We maintained our focus on employee wellness and expanded our initiatives in 2023. In addition to the ongoing training and fitness consultations for our team members from staff at Provicta and Health Quotient, we began establishing our Employee Wellness Coordinator program in both the Police and Fire Divisions. Our Wellness Coordinators are volunteers from our team who serve as wellness leaders. They assist team members with their wellness and help identify future wellness needs and educational topics. In the fall of 2023, we were awarded an Assistance to Firefighters Grant from Federal Emergency Management Agency that enabled our team to bring the robust fitness offerings of Provicta and Health Quotient to

our firefighters. We look forward to getting our firefighters in the Provicta 90-day wellness immersion program in early 2024.

The Police Division staff had the exciting opportunity to launch the Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) program in 2023. The purchase and training of our staff was made possible through a generous donation, which, is yet another example of the tremendous support our Department has from our community. Our Police Division improved our overall clearance rate to 71% for NIBRS Group A and B; even more impressive is our teams work on crimes against people, achieving a clearance rate of 85% in 2023.



The implementation of the daytime duty crew in the Fire Division continues to improve the delivery of fire services

during the hours 6 AM to 6 PM Monday through Friday. Our part-time firefighters on the duty crew responded to 429 calls for service in 2023, which was 52% of the total fire calls for service in 2023. Although we experienced a high level of turn-over within the part-time



firefighter position in 2023, we are committed to stabilizing our part-time firefighter workforce throughout 2024.

It continues to be an honor to work alongside the dedicated professionals of Lino Lakes Public Safety Department as we strive to deliver exceptional service to our great and supportive community. Thank you!

Police Division

The Police Division of the Lino Lakes Public Safety Department made some great additions in 2023. In September, Officer Beck Petrie was hired and successfully made his way through field training. Once out of training, Officer Petrie quickly became a strong contributor on patrol.

Another great addition in 2023, was the implementation of the department's Unmanned Aerial System (UAS) program which became operational in late June. With donated funding,

our agency was able to purchase two exterior UAS's and one interior UAS. Throughout the year, four officers achieved their Part 107 certification through the Federal Aviation Administration, allowing them to fly our UAS for public safety purposes. From June through December, the agency's UAS's were deployed on eight significant events. The most noteworthy search was an interior warrant search of a home wherein a known violent offender was found by UAS hiding in a bedroom closet and surrendered after seeing the UAS.

The agency retired three patrol fleet vehicles and replaced them with three Tahoe's which have vehicle-to-



vehicle emergency lighting synchronization package. This lighting system links the emergency lighting timing for the squads, resulting in clearer direction being given to oncoming motorists which is most beneficial on scenes with multiple police vehicles. There are now six patrol vehicles on our roads with this system.



Our agency continued our community outreach initiatives and community education seminars in 2023 with a strong commitment to crime prevention and awareness. Throughout the year, our police staff hosted or presented on the following: robbery awareness for financial institutions, multiple scam awareness seminars for seniors, personal safety and self-defense for women, coffee with a cop, teen driver education for new drivers and parents, MN DNR firearm safety certificate course, MN DNR snowmobile safety certificate course.

Staff also partnered with other organizations in the following ways: YMCA Super Hero Camp, partnered with the Lino Lakes Volunteers in Public Safety in their very successful Breakfast with Santa and 7th annual Guns-N-Hoses hockey events, presented at the Rice Lake Kids Club Water Days, attended the Lino Lakes Elementary Truck Visit,

participated in the Forest Lake Area Clay Target Team's Back your Buddy trap shooting event, partnered with staff at The Rookery for their Secret Holiday Shop event, partnered with Special Olympics Minnesota on a fundraising event, partnered with neighboring agencies and school districts for a Heroes and Helpers holiday shopping event, and partnered with Toys for Joy.

Throughout 2023, the police division continued as the primary responders to medical calls

for service. Fire division staff responded to all major medical emergencies, as well as emergencies when police staff were tied up on other priorities. Throughout the year, police staff responded to 1,183 calls for medical-related services, an increase of 229 calls from 2022 and an increase of 364 from 2021. The average response time for medical-related calls was 4 minutes, 38 seconds.

The police division's canine, Argos, and handler, Officer Wills, continued their service in 2023. Throughout the year, Argos was deployed 13 times. Of those deployments, three



were in Lino Lakes, 10 were in other communities. The canine team conducted a total of 187 hours of training in 2023.

Investigations

The mission of the Lino Lakes Public Safety Department Investigations Unit is to provide justice through compassionate communication with our victims and by conducting thorough criminal investigations.

In 2023, the investigations team consisted of three investigators, an investigative assistant, and a sergeant. The team worked towards the mission by performing investigations into a variety of crimes against people and property. Crimes against people included assault, criminal sexual assault, violation of protection orders, neglect of vulnerable adults, and child endangerment. Property crimes included fraud, damage to property, burglary, motor vehicle theft, and retail theft, just to name a few. We investigated a total of 302 criminal cases and referrals from child and adult protection agencies, 71 of which were submitted for charging consideration.

The investigations team also conducted background investigations, processed data and discovery requests, managed property and evidence, and handled civil forfeitures. The team completed 304 data discovery requests and conducted 223 background investigations for city permits and employment purposes.

In addition to their regular duties as investigators, team members regularly assisted the patrol unit by responding to complex and resource demanding calls, instructing multiple department wide use of force and firearms training sessions, and helped to prepare multiple new officers for patrol duties.

Administrative Division and Emergency Management

The professional standards and development of our public safety teams continues to be a high priority for the Lino Lakes Public Safety Department. Our team members train and study regularly to ensure they are ready to provide the highest quality service when they are needed.

Our Police Division stays up-to-date on industry best standards, current case law, and all state and federally mandated training requirements. Our dedicated training unit designs creative training curriculum to challenge our police officers and create a training environment that fosters growth, creative thinking, and high expectations. Our training unit works collaboratively with the Minnesota Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) board to ensure our training is up-to-date and of the highest quality, meeting POST standards. Our teams also utilize our in-house digital training system to help develop their decisions making skills under pressure. All our police officers train on mental health awareness, de-escalation techniques, autism awareness, implicit bias, and conflict resolution so that we may continue to serve our communities with the highest regard.

Our Fire Division continued to train twice per month on a variety of life-saving topics to include fire suppression techniques, search and rescue, emergency medical care, emergency vehicle extrication, and water rescue. Additionally, our fire team trained on fire scene safety and security, emergency vehicle operations, incident command, and hazardous materials response. Our training is designed and taught by industry experts with the public safety training firm, Fire Inc. In addition to month training with Fire Inc, each station held additional training once per month on station specific topics and team building exercises.

Our Lino Lakes Public Safety Records Unit continued to provide a high level of customer service and efficiency in 2023. The records unit staffs the front service window at the Public Safety Department and provides phone support Monday through Friday. In addition to helping connect citizens to public safety services, our records unit also processed:

- 6,932 Police Reports and Supplemental reports
- 1,227 Citations
- 181 Permits to Purchase Firearms
- 107 City Dog Licenses
- 506 Local Records Checks
- 538 Criminal History Queries
- 20 Burn Permit Applications

Fire Division



The Fire Division implemented a staffed Duty Crew of Firefighters, Monday through Friday from 6 AM to 6 PM. This program has been very successful. The response time for calls for service during this time have greatly improved. With firefighters at each of our fire stations, it only takes a minute for the crew to go en route after receiving a call. In 2023, we increased the types of calls this crew responds to, which includes more EMS type calls.


The Fire Division responded to 825 calls for service in 2023, compared to 585 in 2022. The majority of the calls were EMS Assist calls. The Fire Division responded to 258 EMS Assist calls in 2023 (NFPA 311), compared to 140 EMS Assist (NFPA 311) in 2022. Through fire suppression efforts, there was \$24,954,556.00 worth of property saved in the City for 2023.


The following figures compare the breakdown of calls for service in 2022 and 2023. The Lino Lakes Public Safety Department responded to 27 calls that involved fire. This is down from 2022 that saw 36 calls that involved fire. Fire Station 1, 7741 Lakes Drive, had 209 calls for service. Fire Station 2, 1710 Birch Street, had 162 calls for service, and our Duty



Officer responded to 25 calls for service. The Duty Officer program ended in May of 2023. The Part-Time Duty Crew responded to 429 calls for service of the 825 total calls for service in 2023.

Volunteer Section

CHAPLAIN PROGRAM - The Lino Lakes Public Safety Department established its Chaplain Program in 2003. Since this date dedicated chaplains have served community members who were experiencing tragedy. Chaplains are on call 24-hours a day, every day of the year and selflessly give their time and energy. Chaplains are often called to some of the most challenging incidents including death scenes, medical emergencies, and providing death notifications. Chaplains provide a reassuring presence at these scenes which are often filled with grief and uncertainty.



Chaplain Pederson

A chaplain's duties extend beyond helping community members facing tragedy, but also to the police officers and fire fighters who serve the

community. The Chaplain Program reinforces the importance of receiving support during difficult times and building relationships founded on care, respect, and trust. Chaplains build relationships and provide support through regular patrol ride-along and one-on-one meetings. Chaplains also attend department roll call meetings, department functions, and community events.

Our current chaplain, Wes Pederson, is from Eagle Brook Church and joined our team in 2016. Chaplain Peterson volunteered more than 230 hours supporting the community in 2023. Chaplain Pederson has been a tremendous asset to the department, community, and all the people he impacts through his service. Through his dedication, Chaplain Pederson has made lasting impacts on the lives of our officers and firefighters.

CERT - The Lino Lakes Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) started in April 2008 with 25 citizens who received training to help their community in times of need. There have been additional training classes offered since 2008 and the program currently has around 30 members. The idea of a Community Emergency Response Team was developed and implemented by the Los Angeles Fire Department in



1985 with the purpose of having trained citizens respond during disaster situations.

In order to become a CERT member, a person must successfully complete a training program that covers topics such as disaster preparedness, fire safety, disaster medical operations, light search and rescue, CERT organization, disaster psychology, and terrorism & CERT. During the last week of training, the members participate in a final scenario where they use their newly learned skills to rescue role-players during a simulated disaster situation.

CERT members have been activated in order to assist police and fire personnel to search for evidence and missing persons as well as participating in community events such as breakfast with Santa, Blue Heron Days and other community events.

CERT members are offered training opportunities as they become available and most members have been trained to be severe storm spotters through Metro SKYWARN.

EXPLORERS – The explorer program is a program sponsored by local law enforcement agencies to provide career information to students between the ages of 14 and 20. It also provides the structure and resources needed for young adults to make ethical choices and to achieve their full potential as individuals. The explorer program also allows explorers to engage in volunteer opportunities and build positive relationships with the community.

The explorer program is a great way for the Lino Lakes Police Department build and foster positive relationships with the youth of our community. Students learn first-hand the duties and responsibilities of police officers, by bringing interested youth and police officers together on a weekly basis. Explorers attend a weekly training throughout the year. During these trainings Explorers are under the guidance and teachings of



officers with the Lino Lakes Police Department. Officers teach the fundamentals of responding to a variety of calls as a police officer. The explorers are taught in a class room lecture setting then placed in built up scenarios. Explorers practice arrest and search, burglary, crime prevention, domestics, DWI scenario, first aid, handcuffing, hostage negotiation, interview and interrogation, searching suspects, street decisions, traffic accidents, traffic stops and white collar crime. With this experience Explorers are able to increase their knowledge of what a career of law enforcement entails and it helps prepare the Explorer to continue down that career path.



In February of 2023, five explorers participated in a cluster training in Washington County to prepare themselves for the Annual Minnesota Police Explorer Conference held in Rochester. Then in March of that year, seven explorers went through a mini state training at the Hero Center in Cottage Grove, which further facilitated readiness for the State competition in Rochester. Our seven explorers were then able to put their knowledge and skills to the test in April as they participated in the Annual Minnesota Police Explorer Conference. Our explorers finished 4th overall at the competition in street decisions and 5th in hostage negotiations.

These conferences provide the explorers with opportunities to meet with their peers and be exposed to law enforcement agencies at the state and federal level. They also have the opportunity to receive college scholarships through their participation in the organization.

Along with attending the explorer conferences, our explorers take pride in volunteering at events scattered throughout the community. In 2023 our explorers volunteered their time for the Annual Guns and Hoses fundraising event, Freedom Fest, Rice Lake Elementary Carnival, 3M Golf Tournament, Night to Unite, Blue Heron Days, Anoka Halloween Parade, Secret Holiday Shop and Lino Lakes Breakfast with Santa. Our explorers totaled 1,238.5 volunteer hours this year

The explorer program is a beneficial program for our agency to connect and build relations with the youth in our community. While building relationships with our youth, we are teaching them skills that help them become more confident and engaging members of our community.

TRAIL WATCH - The Lino Lakes Public Safety Department's Trail Watch Program utilizes a partnership between civilian volunteers and sworn staff, in the joint pursuit of providing an additional crime prevention presence in our parks and on our trails. Trail Watch volunteers share information about current issues that need monitoring, and keep an eve on the areas of the city that they frequently visit.

The group currently consists of 24 volunteers who, in 2023, completed 543 hours of patrol. In addition to responding to urgent, ongoing incidents, these volunteers diligently report potential safety hazards, request maintenance for areas requiring repair, and notify officers of any criminal activities discovered post-occurrence. Our parks and trails are a beautiful part of this community, and the contributions made by each of our Trail Watch volunteers ensure that these areas remain safe and welcoming for all to use.

RESERVES – In 2023, the Lino Lakes Public Safety Department Reserve Unit was comprised of an average of 4 volunteer reserve officers. In July, we lost a reserve officer with over 17 years of volunteer dedication to this agency who needed to dedicate more time to education and a new job. One of our newer reserve officers briefly took on the duties of Community Service Officer for our agency, then came back to us as a reserve due to scheduling conflicts with work and school. The reserve officers supported the functions of the Public Safety Department in multiple areas. The Police Reserves

participated in community events, provided traffic and pedestrian safety, provided uniformed patrol in marked patrol cars, were called out on 2 occasions to look for a missing person, and conducted home and business checks.

The reserve officers also assisted full time officers with community education, training events, prisoner transports and select calls for service. Their involvement and participation within the department are all in an effort to help fulfill the mission of the department by providing a healthy and safe community, focusing on prevention, promoting life safety, aggressively pursuing criminals, encouraging volunteerism and continuing to enhance and strengthen the agency's community oriented policing philosophy. The reserves also assisted neighboring agencies on several occasions, which included traffic direction and helping with a security detail for President Biden.

In 2023, the Public Safety Department Reserve Officers were trained by LLPD staff and the reserve unit command staff in Taser Operations, Use of Force, Scenario Based Decision Making, Ground Fighting, Incident Command Structure, First Aid / CPR, Officer Wellness, Vehicle Operations, and Firearms.

Reserve officers handled 9 transports, assisted officers on 25 calls and handled 5 ordinance/public assist calls for service, delivered 23 packets, handled 71 radio calls and provided nearly 56 hours of neighborhood patrol. This assistance enabled sworn officers to remain in Lino Lakes, available to patrol the city and to respond to calls for service. Throughout 2023, the Public Safety Department Reserve Officers donated nearly 750 hours of service to our community.
