


Winter is nearly here, which means the holidays and the New Year will soon be too. Therefore, it's a good time to reflect on all that has happened throughout Lino Lakes in 2023, and take a small look ahead at what is to come.

Budget discussions began in August, and although they still need to be completed at this writing, Council has progressed from the first budget work session to adopting the preliminary 2024 tax levy. The initial tax levy adopted in September results in an estimated tax rate of 36%, up slightly from the 2023 tax rate of 35%. The City Council must approve a final budget and tax levy before the end of the year.

Development continues to be strong on several fronts in the City. In 2023, the City saw many grand openings of great commercial businesses like Kwik Trip, Hotworx, Thielen & Green Architects, Renstrom Dental, Tidal Wave Auto Spa, and F45 Fitness. New construction continues at the New Horizons Academy, Starbucks Coffee, Heartland Dental, and Lil Explorers Childcare Center.

Drawings, plans, and specs are being worked on for a Water Treatment Facility along Birch Street.

This past summer, the project received 13 million in grant funding from the State of Minnesota Legislature.

Design work is also underway for the extension of Otter Lake Road heading north on the east side of Lino Lakes. Otter Lake Road is an exciting project to open up an expanded commercial and industrial corridor with city sewer and water. The project is an opportunity to create more of a shovel-ready corridor, providing opportunities for new business development and improving the City's transportation system. The city staff and engineers continue to do an excellent job looking for county, state, and federal funding opportunities for all these critical projects within the City.

Many positive things are happening for Lino Lakes in 2024. And as your Mayor, I will continue to serve our City and work with Council to improve life in Lino Lakes for all.

May your holiday season be joyous and safe.

We are currently hiring **Paid-On-Call Firefighters** for both of our City's fire station locations.

What is a Paid-On-Call Firefighter?

The Lino Lakes Public Safety Department depends on its Paid-On-Call-Firefighter to provide a timely response when the alarm sounds. Under the direction of Lino Lakes fire officers, a Paid-On-Call-Firefighter is responsible for responding to calls and extinguishing fires, protecting life and property, and operating and maintaining fire equipment apparatus.

Lino Lakes Public Safety Paid-On-Call-Firefighter are expected, when available, to respond to their assigned fire station when paged for an emergency incident. The Lino Lakes Public Safety Fire Division relies on the response of firefighters to ensure adequate apparatus and personnel are sent to scenes for crews to work safely and effectively to save lives and property.

If you live within 9 minutes of one of the fire stations and you have a desire to serve your community and help others, then we are looking for YOU!

Training

All Paid-On-Call-Firefighter recruit training is paid for the City. If you do not have previous firefighting experience or emergency medical education, you will be provided with equipment and support to complete Firefighter I and II training at the Anoka County Fire Academy. The courses at the academy will introduce you to the basic knowledge and skills necessary to perform firefighting tasks. At the end of this training, you will complete both a written and a practical exam to then become certified by the Minnesota Fire Certification Board as a Firefighter II.



During entry-level firefighter training, you will also be involved in Lino Lakes Public Safety new recruit training. The purpose of this training is to provide a standard set of requirements and skills in addition an understanding

of the Lino Lakes Public Safety Fire Divisions policies, procedures, special orders and evaluations prior to being an authorized responder for the City of Lino Lakes.

2024 Annual Budget

At the September 25, 2023 meeting, the City Council adopted a preliminary 2024 tax levy of \$14,120,928, a 9.52% increase above the 2023 tax levy. The preliminary tax levy maintains essential services and programs while the City continues to experience rising costs in the current inflationary environment.

The 2024 tax levy increase can be attributed to:

- Wages and benefits of current personnel
- Increased cost for supplies and services
- Recreation funding returning to pre-pandemic levels
- Purchase of two fire apparatus
- Pavement management funding to maintain target street condition ratings

Winter Aquatics Programming

The Rookery swim lesson program is geared towards teaching children and adults the skills that build selfconfidence in and out of the water. We offer group and private lessons in our warm water pools, which are kept at an average of 87F in the splash pool, and 82°F in the lap pool. The warm water temperatures promote happier swimming for young swimmers.

Group lessons are taught in groups of 4-6 participants per class, and each lesson is 30 minutes in length. Our swim lesson program is divided by swim ability and age starting at 6 months.

If you are looking for more individualized instruction and experience, private lessons provide 1-on-1 teaching experience for children and adults of all ages and ability levels.



WINTER HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

Follow these winter safety tips to ensure that you have a safe holiday season.



Holiday hosting safety

- Use flameless candles when decorating holidays.
- Make sure exit paths and exits are clear of holiday decorations and clutter.
- Never leave food cooking on the stove unattended.
- Keep a timer with you when baking in the oven so you don't lose track of time; check on items in the oven frequently.

Christmas tree safety

- · Never block an exit with a Christmas tree.
- Only use non-flammable decorations.
- Keep trees away from heat sources and vents.
- Remove the tree from your home when the needles are brittle or begin to fall off.
- Pick a tree stand that can hold the tree securely. The Stand should hold enough water for two days.

Winter safety

- Keep all doors and windows that could be used for an escape route clear of snow and ice.
- Keep all vents (fireplace, dryer, furnace and oven) clear of snow, ice and debris.
- Never use a blow torch to thaw frozen pipes.
- Use flashlights, not candles, if you lose power.
- Keep anything that can burn three feet from heat sources; do not use your oven to heat your home.



Beware of Porch Pirates

With our winter holidays approaching, many of us will have an increase in package deliveries at our homes. We would like to encourage you to take steps to help reduce the chances of becoming a victim of doorstep package theft. Consider these strategies when ordering package delivery:

- Schedule your delivery for a time when someone will be home to receive it.
- Sign up for delivery alerts to stay informed when a package will be delivered.
- If you're not home when a package is delivered, ask a neighbor to pick it up for you.
- Provide delivery instructions, asking the driver to place the package in an inconspicuous area.
- Install a doorbell camera so you are notified when a package is delivered.

Winter is Coming CITY PLOWING SCHEDULE

Snow plowing operations generally commence with accumulations of two inches of snow or more. Accumulations of less than two inches may also trigger operations if they are combined with icy or drifting conditions in which salt and/or sand will be applied following guidelines within the Minnesota Manual Snow & Ice Management.

To keep traffic moving, crews first plow streets that connect neighborhoods to State and County roads. Plowing operations stop if strong winds and drifting result in unsafe conditions; plowing resumes when conditions improve. For evening or overnight accumulations, all available workers normally begin plowing streets at 3:00am. For typical snow falls, it generally takes 7 to 9 hours for our Public Works Department to clear the 200+ lane miles of City streets. For plowing updates, follow us at www.facebook.com/linolakesmn.

Winter Parking Restrictions

Beginning November

1st through April 1st of each year in Lino Lakes, winter parking restrictions are in effect. Parking vehicles on any public street within the City is prohibited between the hours of 2:00am - 6:00am in the above time frame. In addition, parking is not allowed on any public street when two inches or more of snow has fallen until the street

has been plowed. Vehicles in violation of the Winter Parking Restrictions may be towed at the owner's expense and the vehicle owner could be charged a petty misdemeanor. (See Lino Lakes City Code Chapter 802 Section 6)



Mailboxes:

To ensure the mail carrier can deliver your mail, please clear snow away from the front of your mailbox. Properly installed mailboxes accidentally toppled by the blade of snow plow will be replaced by City crews as soon as time and conditions allow.

Plowing Trails:

The City of Lino Lakes does its best to clear trails and sidewalks across the city. Trails and sidewalks in close proximity to schools receive higher priority and are plowed quickly after a snow event. Other trails are cleared as time allows in the days following a snow event. Please note there are a few trails throughout the city that are left unplowed. If you have any questions or concerns regarding snow removal on sidewalks and trails, please contact the Public Services Department at 651-982-2440.

Garbage Cans/Recycle Containers:

Keep garbage cans and recycling containers behind the curb line and off roadways and sidewalks. Containers placed in the street or at the end of the driveway may be damaged or knocked over.





WHAT RESIDENTS CAN DO TO HELP THIS WINTER SEASON

Effective snow removal involves citizen collaboration. Follow the reminders below to help stay safe this winter season.

- Keep kids' toys, sleds, and basketball hoops away from the street.
- Do not build snow forts along the street and in piles in cul-de-sacs. Plow drivers cannot see inside the forts and do not want to injure anyone.
- Keep a minimum distance of 100 feet when encountering snowplows and sand trucks.
- Do not drive into a snow cloud or pass vehicles while they're plowing.
- Keep snow off the road when shoveling, pushing, or blowing snow. Putting snow in the street can cause snow and ice buildup on the road making conditions hazardous.
- Keep fire hydrants clear and accessible during the winter. If you have a fire hydrant located near your house, please work with your neighbors to keep a cleared path from the street to the fire hydrants and a cleared 6-foot area around the fire hydrant. By doing this fire fighters will be able to easily locate and access the fire hydrant in case of an emergency.
- Report issues, such as slippery intersections, potholes, snow plow damage, etc., by calling the Public Service Department at 651-982-2440.

HALT THE SALT

Help keep surfaces safe and water clean. Did you know that just 1 teaspoon of salt permanently pollutes 5 gallons of freshwater? Chlorides found in road salt are harmful to wildlife, soil, and groundwater. They also disrupt the seasonal lake cycles that make our lakes enjoyable, and corrode cars, bridges, and streets.

Smart salting, good habits:

- Use tools first: shovel, scraper, or broom.
- Disperse salt or other de-icers evenly without piles. The goal is not to form a blanket, but to break the bonds of ice/compacted snow.
- Once salt crystals infiltrate the ice/compacted snow, a scraper can chop and scrape the surface. Shoveling off the ice chunks reduces the need to re-apply. Salt that's diluted with meltwater becomes less effective; re-freezing occurs and raises the risk for falls.
- More product doesn't mean faster results: the chemical reaction depends on temperature.
- Excess product remains in meltwater and runoff.
- Never apply de-icers to dry pavement or loose snow.
- Sweep up extra salt and sand.

SNOWMOBILE SAFETY COURSE



Officers with the Lino Lakes Public Safety Department will be conducting a DNR Youth Snowmobile Certification course again this year. This course is being offered to youth, ages 11-15 (certification becomes valid at age 12). This training course is at an introductory level, designed to help the snowmobile rider become familiar with laws and safety information related

to snowmobile operation. Participants who successfully complete this course will be eligible for certification through the MN DNR.

There is a \$30.00 course fee for online materials, along with a \$5.00 processing fee, required by the Minnesota DNR for the official certification. All payments are made electronically to the DNR after successfully completing the course.

The certification course takes place in two sessions. One introductory, in-person, classroom session with a requirement to complete online training at home, then one additional in-person session for the driving test. During the introductory session, the instructors will distribute the course materials, discuss the course outline, and answer related questions. Parents/guardians are encouraged to attend.

Classroom session: Tuesday, January 9th from 5:00pm – 6:00pm **Driving session:** Saturday, January 27th from 8:00am – 12:00pm Sessions will take place at the Lino Lakes Public Safety Department (640 Town Center Parkway).

CITY PARK UPDATES

Brandywood Park and Birchwood Acres: New Playground Equipment

The City Council approved the replacement of the aged playground equipment at Brandywood Park and Birchwood Acres Park. The Brandywood playground was installed in 2000 and the Birchwood Acres playground in 1996. Parks Department staff has already begun dismantling the existing playground structure and prepping the playground areas for a 2024 spring/summer installation.

Two playground concept plans for each park have been created. Area residents of Brandywood Park and Birchwood Acres are encouraged to review and provide input on their proposed concepts for their respective parks. Staff, along with the playground designer, will then develop a final playground design unique to each park and order the equipment. Parks Department staff, along with a certified playground installer, will install the playground equipment this coming Spring/Summer!

In 2022, the City of Lino Lakes pumped over 600,000,000 gallons of water to meet user demand. Water for residential use equated to approximately 80 gallons per person per day. A goal of the Lino Lakes Water Supply Plan is to bring residential water demand to less than 75 gallons per person per day.

Did you know...

With 37% of the City's 21,000 acres covered by lakes or wetlands, water is a predominate feature of our landscape. However, that doesn't mean we can take it for granted. Whether you are on the City's water supply system or have a private well in your backyard, the water we drink, use for cooking and cleaning all comes from groundwater lying below the surface. According to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resource, Minnesota residents use approximately 52 gallons a day on average. Meanwhile, residents in Lino Lakes are using approximately 80 gallons per person per day.

Help us meet our goal!

One of the largest sources of water usage is outdoor irrigation, but indoors; toilets, showers, washing machines, dishwashers, faucets, and leaks are some of the biggest contributors to water use. Water use and needs fluctuate throughout the year and cause outdoor or indoor water use to be higher or lower. If Lino Lakes want to meet its goals, residents will have to consider their own overall usage and how they can bring it within 75 gallons a day per person.

Estimate your household's water use goal:

75 x # of members in your household = ____ # of gallons of water use per day 7 x ____ # of gallons of water use per **day**

Compare your quarterly water use goal to your actual usage to see how your household is doing on reaching the 75 gallon goal. Look under the meter reading, find "cons" (consumption) and multiply this number by 1,000 to get your quarterly use.



If your household's water usage is higher than your use goal, ask yourself some of the following questions to see how you might be able to help conserve water:

- How long are my showers and can I can I shorten them? Water-saving shower heads may only use about 2 gallons of water per minute. Older showers use up to 5 gallons of water per minute.
- How frequently am I taking baths? A bath uses about 36 gallons of water.
- · How often am I running the dishwasher over doing **dishes by hand?** Handwashing dishes uses anywhere from 9 to 27 gallons of water depending on efficiency, while dishwashers use 6 to 16 gallons of water per load depending on model and age of dishwasher.
- Are my dishwasher and laundry loads full? New clothes washers use around 25 gallons of water per load whereas older ones use about 40 gallons of water.
- Have I checked my toilet and faucets for leaks?
- Do I need to replace any of my appliances and can I buy a replacement that has a WaterSense label?
- · How frequently am I irrigating my lawn? (lawns only need 1 inch of water per week)

By enacting these small changes, you can Drive for 75 gallons per day and help the City reach its goals!

Guidelines for Recycling Plastics

No Bulky Plastic Items

Items like plastic toys, chairs, or baskets, should not be placed in curbside recycling. They often are made of multiple types of materials making them difficult to recycle.



Only #1,2,5 Plastic Can Be Recycled



Items marked with a #1, #2, or #5 can be repurposed into something else. Plastic items that can be recycled are

food and beverage bottles, milk and juice jugs, laundry containers, shampoo and soap bottles, and clear cups and produce containers. Make sure these are cleaned out as best you can and keep the caps on so they don't get lost in recycling facilities.

Please DO NOT recycle:

- Black plastic such as takeout containers: The technology at recycling facilities cannot detect this material.
- Plastic straws and utensils: Small items get lost in recycling facilities. Try to use reusable utensils instead.
- Plastic bags such as grocery bags: although these are sometimes labeled as #2, these should not be put in curbside recycling. These can get tangled in the machinery used to sort items and need to be manually cut off. Many stores have plastic bag drop off programs you can bring them to instead.

The above recyling programs are funded by the Anoka County Board of Commissioners and State SCORE (Select Committee on Recycling and the Environment) funds.
